Fees for 2018



Please read our HEY Fever Fee Policies before enrolling your child:

- Each Semester is broken up into two terms. Payment for the semester is broken down into two payments, one per term.
- Fees are to be paid in full, or have a payment plan in place, prior to the first week of term.
- Fees are to be paid for all classes whether students are in attendance or absent.
- A non-refundable deposit to secure your child's place for the semester is required 2 weeks prior to semester start.
- All new families will need to attend the Meet & Greet Open Day at their selected venue the week before classes start back for the year (if enrolled at both venues, simply attend one meeting).
- Fees are set at \$16 for the first enrolled class for the day and \$11 for each class after that, per week, payable by the term.
- Enrollment can be made at either venue with fees being consistent across all venues.
- All equipment such as stationary including paper, pens, pencils, printing and laminating is supplied.
- Parents will need to supply items like Art Folders & Technology (IPad/Tablets/Laptops) where applicable.
- The Textiles, Wood & Textiles and Art class may have additional costs, like buying personal fabrics, t-shirts or canvasses, depending on projects chosen by the group at the commencement of the semester.
- There is a 10+% sibling discount for the 3rd child or more enrolled in our classes.
- Kidsport Vouchers are accepted to contribute \$200 to the fees of one sports class for one semester in the year (\$100 per term). This is available for all Table Tennis, PE, Teen Fit Boxing and Personal Fitness Classes only.
- Our classes run for 75 minutes in small groups of 8 - 12 students.
- Most classes have mixed age groupings allowing students of all ages to interact in classes together, while still focusing on the individual needs of each student.

English

English - English is firstly a language..... the English class focuses on how to effectively communicate in this language. Students will express themselves not only in the written word, but verbally through discussion, debates and public speaking. Students may create books, brochures, flyers, news articles, speeches etc. Classes will involve word processing skills and will require some form of technology (iPad/Tablet/Laptop) with required apps installed!

Humanities & Social Sciences

Social Anthropology - Social Anthropology is the study of human societies, countries and cultures. We are a multicultural society- we need to understand each other to be able to live and work together. Discovering who we are through how/who others are! Classes will involve internet research and word processing skills which will require some form of technology (iPad/Tablet/Laptop) with required apps installed!

History (Reenacting) - Explore History.....what happened, why it happened, where it happened and who it happened to.... while performing it through drama! Students research the facts and then reenact it....a very enjoyable way to learn history!- Classes will involve internet research and word processing skills and would recommend some form of technology (iPad/Tablet/Laptop) with required apps installed!

Life Planning 101 - Classes focus on students as an individual - learning about who they are, what they want to become and the steps to getting there. Classes will involve goal setting, action plans, task analysis, career guidance and training options, developing life long habits, establishing a good work ethic to future success. Some form of technology (iPad/Tablet/Laptop) with required apps installed is a requirement!



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Sciences

Science - Classes for all ages that are hands on! Classes will include discussion, analysis and hands on experiments, enabling students to explore all strands of the science curriculum creatively by learning and having fun. The four sub-strands (Biological, Chemical, Earth and Space, Physical) will be covered over the entire year.

Zoology - is the branch of science that studies animals, from all the flying things in the air to all that move upon the earth. Students will research and discuss different creatures and then create word processing documents or Powerpoint projects to demonstrate their learning. Some form of technology (iPad/Tablet/Laptop) which required apps installed is a requirement for this class!

Human Biology - Students will learn about their bodies, food & nutrition and healthy living as well as producing disgusting science experiments along the way! Come along and explore the insides of ourselves...the Good, the Bad and the Ugly! Some form of technology (iPad/Tablet/Laptop) is recommended for this class!

Technologies

Wood & Textiles - Students will create with wood and textile projects/artworks. This class will include tool identification & safety, whittling, sawing, pyrography (wood burning), hammering, painting & staining! Projects in the past have included burning & whittling projects like hedgehogs and book ends, wooden robots, string art and stencils for t-shirts. Extra costs may be involved for personal projects. For example: own t-shirts for stenciling

Textiles - Students will create textile projects/artworks. This will include hand sewing, embroidery, crochet, macramé, knotting, knitting, pattern following and working with leather. Extra costs may be involved for personal projects. For example: fabric and cotton for own pillow case.



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The Arts

Art - Classes will include drawing with pencil, crayons, pastels, chalk, painting with acrylics, working with papier mache, modeling clay , performance art and installation. Extra costs may be involved for personal projects. For example: own canvasses for painting

Drama - Building confidence and life skills through creativity. Includes dressing up, costume design, playwriting, voice projection, stage craft etc. Scripts will be learned and performed at the Presentation afternoon at the end of the semester.

Musical Theatre - Students will work on dialogue, singing, stage craft and choreography. Songs with choreography will be learned and performed at the Presentation afternoon at the end of the semester.

Choir - Students will focus on developing choir fundamentals like posture, breathing, diction, pitch and rhythm while singing to popular tunes. Songs will be learned and performed at the Presentation afternoon at the end of the semester.

Puppetry - Students will be introduced to the basics of puppetry to bring puppets to life, from creating scripts, to puppet manipulation and performance creation. Our teacher has an amazing collection of puppets for students to experience!

Tech Drawing - Students use drafting boards, with T-squares and set squares to create technical art works. Techniques include lines and shading, oblique and isometric views, aestheometry, linear perspective and op art!

Technical Art - Children will create works of art with a mathematical flair. Includes space and depth perception, op art, different perspectives as well as precision with rulers and compasses!

Photography & Digital Media - Students will take a variety of photographs and assemble them in digital media projects. Classes will involve word processing and graphic design skills and will require some form of technology (iPad/Tablet/Laptop) with required apps installed! Extra apps may also be needed as we progress, for example: photo processing apps.

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Work Studies - Economics & Business, Vocational Skill Development & Employment Readiness

Life Planning 101 - Classes focus on students as an individual - learning about who they are, what they want to become and the steps to getting there. Classes will involve goal setting, action plans, task analysis, career guidance and training options, developing life long habits, establishing a good work ethic to future success. Some form of technology (iPad/Tablet/Laptop) with required apps installed is a requirement!

Physical Education

PE (Junior & Senior)- Students will develop coordination, balance and agility through circuits, team games, sports and athletic skills. Students will have the opportunity to work collaboratively, improve their communication skills, build healthy relationships and learn how to play fairly.

Table Tennis - The perfect Olympic sport for all ages, improving reflexes, hand-eye coordination, mental alertness, balance, coordination and brain function, whilst having fun!

Teen Fit Boxing- Students will get fit while using boxing techniques. Includes pad work, fitness and agility training.

Personal Training- Students will focus on themselves and what training is healthy for them and their body type. Classes include strength training, personal routines and exercises.
